Climate and environmental impact

- Salmon and marine life protection
- Lowering environmental impact
- Reduction of vehicle miles traveled and incentives for E-vehicles

Congestion relief

- Clear plan for congestion relief
- Strong need for multimodal transportation
- Commute reliability
- Resiliency for customers
- Commuter lanes on both sides

Equity

- Improved neighborhood and community quality
- Economic empowerment, job opportunity and community benefit


Examples of Contextual and Physical Changes

- Regional, state, and local climate goals and priorities
- Developments in downtown Vancouver and Hayden Island
- Oregon tolling/congestion pricing
- Demographics
- COVID-19 impacts on transportation
- Environmental regulations


- Expanded transit opportunities (i.e. BRT and bus-on-shoulder)
- Past and updated Regional Transportation Plans
- Updates to FAA requirements
- Land use policies, planned development, and zoning changes
- Federal transit funding requirements
- Freight/industrial activity




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






Design Options and the IBR Solution

Design Options

- Specific design choices that address physical or contextual changes
- Will be considered on their own and in relation to other program elements



Alternative/IBR Solution

 Single combination of design options that, when packaged together, address the identified transportation problems

Design Option Screening Criteria

 Requirements used to assess the trade-offs or potential impacts among the design options considered

Example 1 - Equity

Promote economic empowerment for communities of concern

Performance Measure

Percent of construction contract values awarded to DBE firms

Note: because all options include this measure, no design option screening criteria will be used to contrast options.

Example 2 - Climate

Outcome

Reduce GHG emissions by converting more SOV trips to transit

Screening Criteria

- Projected reduction in percent of vehicular traffic on I-5
- Projected increase in transit ridership


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Design Option

- Develop design options to address changes
- Use data and analysis to evaluate design options
- Engage advisory groups and community
- Narrow design options for each change to a single solution



Applying Your Input: Community Values and Priorities

Shapes Program Outcomes

- Center the equity in the program's process and outcomes
- Improve resiliency to climate change
- Foster leadership and cooperation between bi-state partners
- Provide meaningful, equitable and transparent community engagement.

Identifies Performance Measures

- Provide all modes to increase capacity
- Contribute to economic empowerment

Defines Screening Criteria

- Reduce congestion
- Provide access to and ensure availability of transportation choices
- Protect and enhance natural resources



Applying Your Input

- What shapes the design option screening criteria?
 - Community Values and Priorities
 - Equity Framework
 - Climate Framework
 - Proposed changes to the Purpose and Need discussed previously
 - Example of a screening criteria category: Efficient movement of people and goods
 - Example of a screening criterion: Number of low-income households within
 1/2 mile of transit station location
- Screening criteria used to evaluate design options
- Inform mitigations and other commitments



Applying Equity and Climate Frameworks

- Overlay for all aspects of the program, including but not limited to
 - Design option screening criteria
 - Program-level performance measures
 - Desired outcomes
 - Community engagement strategies
 - Environmental impacts analysis and mitigation
 - Bridge, highway and transit design
 - Construction specifications and procurement strategies
 - IGAs and Community Benefits Agreements
 - Program commitments: community enhancements and mitigation
