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


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How to access closed captions



In 2010, people of color made up 25% of the Portland Metro region's population.








Population born outside the U.S. 2019













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
Households without a vehicle 2010


Households without a vehicle 2019



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Concentrations of Jobs IBR program area & vicinity, 2018






Concentrations of Jobs Portland Metro Region, 2018
