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



IBR ESG Draft Charter

Purpose:

- The Charter outlines the charge and operating protocols for the Interstate
 Bridge Replacement (IBR) Program Executive Steering Group (ESG) and
 clarifies the roles and responsibilities of the ESG throughout the IBR process.
- The Charter is intended to create common expectations about how the ESG members will work together and puts an emphasis on clear communication, trust building, respect for divergent views, creative thinking, the pursuit of mutual goals, and authentic community engagement.

IBR ESG Draft Charter

- Charge and Responsibilities
- Decision Making Process and Commitments
- Overarching Guiding Principles and Core Values
- Membership and Participants

- Meeting Principles and Participation
- Meeting Format and Process Support

- Agreement and Adoption

Equity Advisory Group (EAG)

Purpose

To provide laser-focus on project's potential impacts and benefits for communities of concern, communities of color, Environmental Justice.

- Help to fulfill IBR Leadership's commitment to prioritize equity throughout the course of the program
- Monitor and provide oversight of equity throughout program in all elements
- Make recommendations to IBR Leadership regarding the program's processes, policies, and decisions that have the potential to impact communities of concern (either positively or negatively)

Equity Advisory Group (cont'd)

Near-term work

- Define 'equity' for IBR program
- Support development of desired outcomes & metrics to achieving 'equity'
- Frame the historical context
- Support implementation of the Community Engagement Plan
- Support DBE/OJT plans
- Coordination with CAG

Longer term work

- Mitigation strategies, including lessening impacts from potential financing options
- Input on design elements
- Other issues as they arise



Equity Advisory Group (cont'd)

Membership

- Equity practitioners with the expertise needed to make informed recommendations
- Representatives from community-based organizations focused on racial equity, social/climate justice, and culturally-specific concerns
- Community members, including those experiencing transportation barriers firsthand

Community Advisory Group (CAG) Purpose

Purpose

To provide input and feedback reflective of the community's needs, issues and concerns to influence the project outcomes of the IBR program. CAG members and the program team will engage in community dialogue with a commitment to meaningful, two-way feedback.

CAG Member Eligibility Criteria

Regular users of the existing Interstate Bridge or impacted by the program are encouraged to apply

- Work together in a collaborative and constructive way to advance the best possible bridge replacement project for I-5 over the Columbia River
- Learn about the transportation issues facing the region, and be interested in the program
- Embrace program values of transparency, equity in transportation, listening to understand, and active participation
- Seek solutions through consensus
- Create a two-way dialogue with their constituents if specifically representing a stakeholder group





Community Advisory Group – 2 Pathways to Involvement



Any community member may apply for the CAG

- The application is open online on December 1 and will close December 18 at 5 p.m. for all interested parties.
- The IBR team will reach out to interested parties regarding next steps.



- The Selection Committee chooses representative organizations from stakeholder groups to serve on the CAG.
- The organizations recommend one member to serve on the CAG.

INTERVIEW



- The Selection Committee* will choose applicants to invite to a 15 minute interview.
- · Appointed members will also meet with the Selection Committee before those positions are confirmed.
- Interviews will be held December 28, 2020 through January 1, 2021.
- · Selected members will be notified by January 13, 2021.

*Selection Committee includes Program Administrator and CAG Co-Chairs






- Seismic vulnerability
- Limited public transportation
- Impaired freight movement
- Inadequate bicycle and pedestrian facilities
- Safety concerns as a result of existing roadway design
- Growing travel demand and congestion

Understanding Today's Context

Early discussions with FHWA and FTA is focusing on our current context:

- Changes to project area (real property and their uses)
- Changes in regulations (Endangered Species Act, US Coast Guard Bridge permits, etc.)
- Change in project needs (transit, interchange designs, vision and values)
- Previous work to define constraints and commitments considered by CRC

IBR Program NEPA Process

Supplemental work that builds on the IBR program's re-evaluation will update Purpose and Need, establish Community Vision and Values, and redefine alternative screening and impact analysis:

- Foundation for the IBR program
- Driven by our federal leads' NEPA process (as defined through a Memorandum of Agreement)
- Through feedback and guidance from Executive Steering Group
- As reviewed through Tribal Coordination, Agency Coordination, and Public Engagement Plans

Conceptual Executive Steering Group Issues List:

- Program Purpose & Need/Vision & Values (NEPA)
- Program Area (NEPA)
- Develop and recommend program performance measures
- Equity and environmental justice strategies (NEPA)
- Transportation demand management strategies\system management strategies
- Community engagement strategies (NEPA)
- Finance plan strategies, including tolling
- Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement alternatives & locally preferred alternative development and adoption process (NEPA)
- · High capacity transit mode
- Multimodal river crossing structure type and configuration

- Freight (especially high, wide, heavy cargo requirements) considerations
- Affected properties mitigation strategy, timeline, and approach (NEPA)

What is the Purpose and Need?

The Purpose and Need section is in many ways the most important chapter of an Environmental Impact Statement*:

- Explains what is being addressed and why it is being considered
- Establishes why financial investment is necessary and justifies why any unavoidable environmental impacts are warranted
- Informs alternatives consideration, in-depth analysis, and final selection of the preferred alternative

What is a Vision and Values Statement?

The purpose of a Vision and Values Statement is to identify specific regional values and goals that the program should consider as alternatives are being developed and evaluated:

- Established in coordination with program partners, stakeholders and the public
- Articulates project goals
- Guides planning and design of the project
- Can be used to develop criteria and performance measures to evaluate alternatives
- Informs the selection and refinement of alternatives

Steps to Develop IBR Program's Purpose and Need/Vision and Values

The following steps will be informed by feedback and guidance from the Executive Steering Group, bi-state legislative committees, advisory groups, and community engagement:



Agency Coordination, Tribal Consultation, and Community Engagement

- Convene a group of agencies with regulatory and approval authorizations that the IBR program triggers; meet regularly to address environmental compliance
- Initiate tribal consultation with all interested tribes
- Conduct early and continuous community engagement

IBR Program NEPA Strategy

- Review the data and analysis conducted during previous planning efforts
- Create context of how that analysis fits in today's context
- Pursue supplemental analysis to determine impacts of changes and best ways to minimize those impacts.
